

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## The Feasts of the Lord

**Leviticus 23:2 (KJV)** Speak unto the children of Israel, and say unto them, *Concerning* the feasts of the LORD, which ye shall proclaim *to be* holy convocations, *even* these *are* my feasts.

**Leviticus 23:4 (KJV)** These *are* the feasts of the LORD, *even* holy convocations, which ye shall proclaim in their seasons.

**Leviticus 23:21 (KJV)** And ye shall proclaim on the self-same day, *that* it may be an holy convocation unto you...*it shall be* a statute for ever in all your dwellings throughout your generations.

These three feast seasons were known as \_\_\_\_\_ (Pesach), \_\_\_\_\_ (Shavuot), and \_\_\_\_\_ (Succot).

They portrayed and represented three major \_\_\_\_\_ with God in the lives of His covenant people.
